**A** Fellowship of the RPS represents, for many, a photographers Everest, and I am thrilled to have achieved it! The question then arises as to what I will do now?

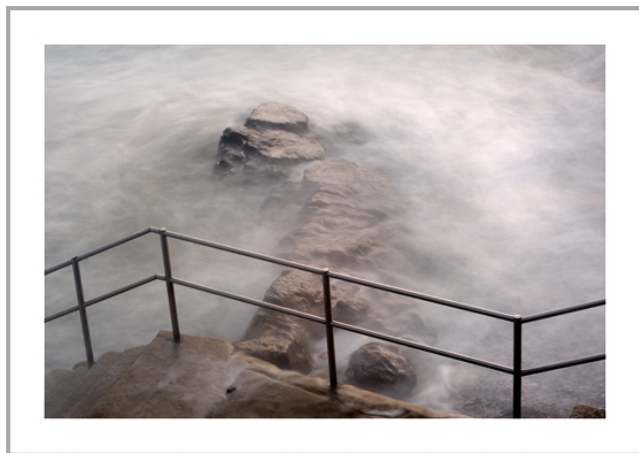
In this lecture I discuss the new challenges I have set myself, the decisions I have made and the photographic directions I am taking in my current work.
